

SRC Clubs and Societies Code of Conduct

1. Code of Conduct

Office bearers are expected to lead by example and uphold the highest standards of conduct within the Club/Society. As representatives of the Club/Society and its values, they play a key role in setting the standard for all members to follow.

All members and office bearers of the Club/Society are expected to uphold reasonable standards of behaviour. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Treating everyone with respect.
- Promoting equality, diversity and inclusion, and refraining from any form of discrimination, harassment or bullying.
- Acting in a way that reflects the aims, values and best interests of the Club/Society.
- Avoid engaging in conduct that may bring the Club/Society into disrepute or adversely affect its reputation.
- Complying with all relevant SRC and University policies, regulations and procedures.

These examples are not exhaustive, and members are expected to conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the values and objectives of the Club/Society at all times.

Members and office-bearers attending any Club/Society event, activity or trip, whether on or off campus, must also comply with the University's Code of Student Conduct.
