She has a really clear and concise teaching method, which is wholeheartedly required in her subject area. She has a real empathy and understanding for how students learn... Most recently, she has used a technology called Scorm in her online lectures, which pauses the lecture at certain points to ask quiz questions mid-video. I had never seen or used it before, and it was an extremely engaging and creative way of helping us understand the information."

Dr Richards is very skilled in using the online sessions to tease out issues and to ensure that all students have a chance to contribute in the session – she is good at balancing "breakout" sessions with "plenary" discussion."

Formatting Moodle so it is logical and makes sense... She is constantly updating Teams with supportive posts and threads"

During lockdown she produced a "Dr Welden has Issues with..." podcast, interviewing her colleagues currently working on aquatic research to discuss topics relevant to her first-year and third-year modules but also to exemplify different pathways into aquatic environmental research and management. Dr Welden is super approachable despite being a notoriously stern marker. Yet, this only motivates her students more to be critical of their own work, just as she employs a critical perspective when discussing any environmental concern, incorporating economic, social ecological perspectives at every turn."
